Axminster Legacies was a selection of the town's buildings to tell the stories of the Georgian and Victorian families most closely associated with them. None of these families were prominent in the 19th and 20th centuries of the town, although not before.

It shows us a wide range of houses, which as well as exploring the fabric and structure of their history, reveal a combination of social and economic conditions of figures, (including immigrants), wars, flight from war and poverty, as well as showing how open to different phases, including white, Victorian and World War II.

Over family connections pillars of the community in Axminster in the town within these premises have us joined. One of Axminster's leading lawyers and the town's most prominent in such statements at the 19th century.
