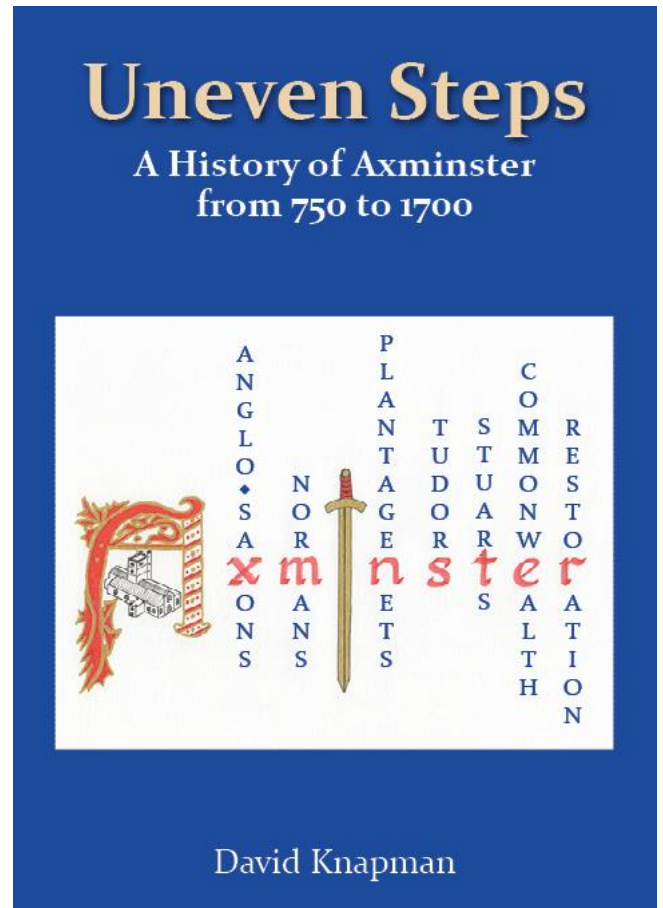

A new book on the early history of Axminster, by David Knapman

‘**Uneven Steps**’ covers the period from the founding of the Minster (from which the name ‘Axminster’ comes) to 1700 (the starting point for his earlier book, ‘Unsteady Progress’).

The 10 chapters cover:

- The Anglo-Saxon origins of Axminster.
- The evidence for and against a 10th century battle in the Axe valley.
- The Norman era, including William Brewer, first Lord of the Manor of Axminster.
- The foundation (in 1247) of Newenham Abbey.
- Almost 300 years of the Abbey’s presence just outside the town.
- The dissolution of the monasteries (in 1539), and the associated social and religious upheaval.
- The stresses and progress evident in the mid-16th century.
- From the Spanish Armada to the eve of Civil War.
- How the Civil War affected Axminster.
- Continuing turbulence and change in the second half of the 17th century.
